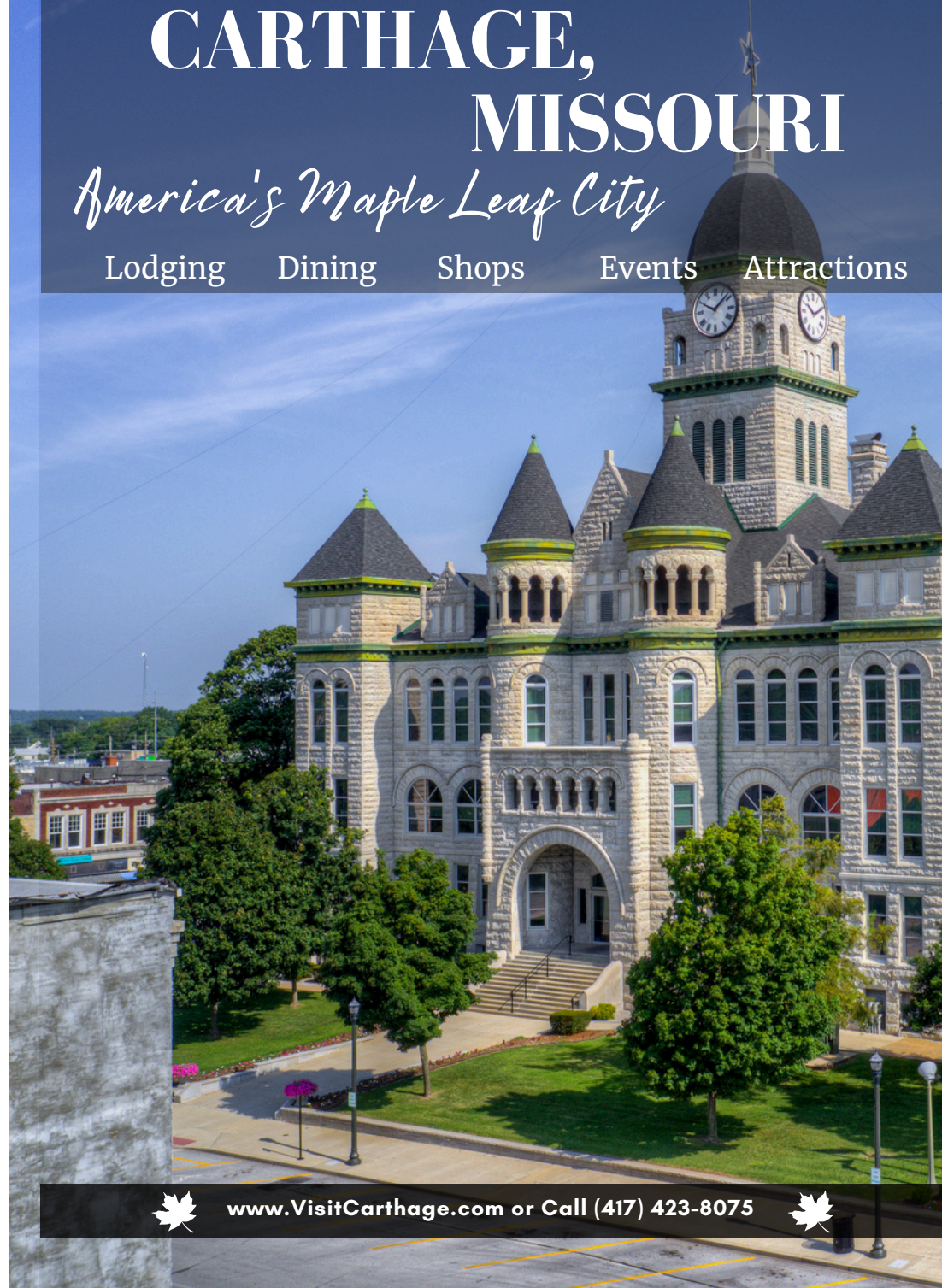

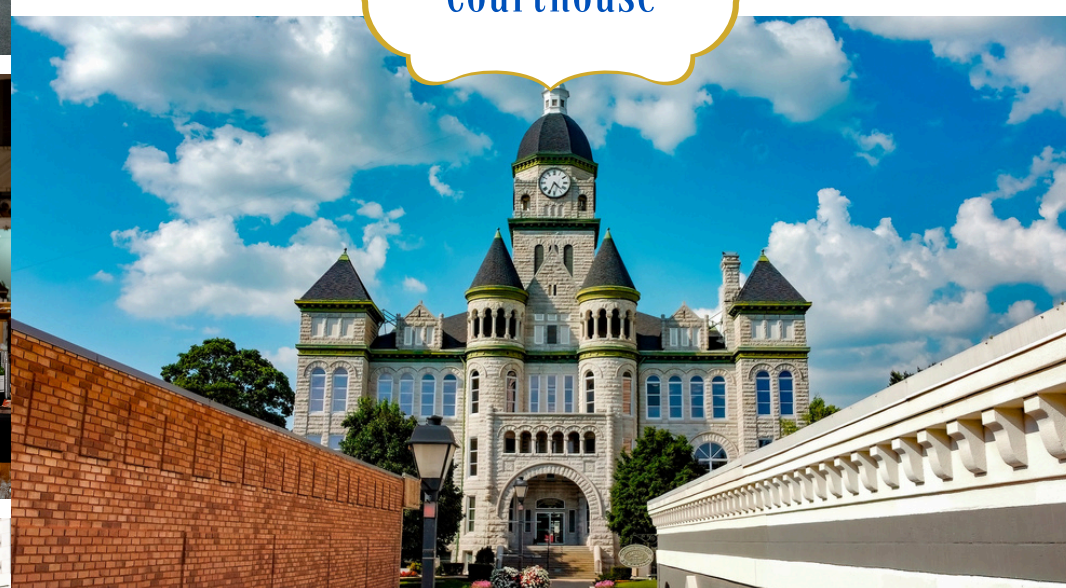
CARTHAGE SQUARE

SHOP- DINE. DISCOVER

Visit the historic Carthage Square for shopping, dining, and historic atmosphere. Centered in the heart of the square is the Jasper County Courthouse. It was first established in 1841 and was burnt down in 1863 during the Civil War and was rebuilt in 1894-95. It remains in use by Jasper County officials today.



The Jasper County Courthouse



The Jasper County Courthouse is open to the public Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Built in 1894-95, inside this Romanesque Revival building, constructed of Carthage stone, you will find items such as a wrought-iron cage elevator that still operates today, a display representing the history of Route 66, military artifacts and mining specimens and a mural by Lowell Davis called "Forged in Fire." This mural portrays the history of Jasper County.

The Jasper County Courthouse is said to be the second-most-photographed building in the state of Missouri.

The Jasper County Courthouse is closed weekends, and on state and national holidays.

ROUTE 66 ROADSIDE ATTRACTION



Boots Court Motel

One of the first concrete-paved portions of Missouri's highway system was the stretch of road west of Carthage to Joplin. It was laid in 1920, becoming part of Route 66. Along Route 66 through Carthage, you will find Kellogg Lake, Carthage Municipal Park, 66 Drive-In and the 1939 Boots Motel and Visitors Center.

Just a few blocks from the Historic Town Square is the famous Boots Motel. This classic example of Streamline Modern Architecture is one of the last left standing along Route 66. Established by Arthur Boots in 1939, the motel is still open today with a radio in every room.

Home to one of the few surviving drive-in theaters left in America, 66 Drive-In is still in operation today along the historic route. The theatre's season runs from April through October, with double features shown every weekend.

Municipal Park is home to the Carthage Saddle Club Arena, which hosts the Carthage Stampede annually in June.

A favorite park of active citizens, Carter Park has an asphalt trail throughout the park that is great for walking and emerging bike riders.

One of our oldest and most popular parks, Central Park is in the middle of town within walking distance to the historic square.

Griggs Park

316 W Centennial
A popular park for leisure visitors and walking traffic. The park has a skate park for skateboarders and multiple pickleball courts. Players can choose from eight courts with LED lights that surround the courts after dark.

Kellogg Lake Park

1215 Esterly Drive
Kellogg Lake is a beautiful place for people to enjoy a full day of activities outdoors. Located right off Route 66, it's a great spot to make a quick stop.

Municipal Park

521 Robert Ellis Young Drive
Municipal Park is the biggest park in Carthage. A Federal Work Project, also known as depression-era WPA funding, developed the property in the 1930s. The Carthage Municipal Pool, the pool house made from native Carthage Stone, several shelters, and the entry stones and walls off Route 66 showcase the historic elegance of traveling the Mother Road.

Fair Acres Park

Created for community recreation and team play, Fair Acres Park has baseball and softball fields. The fields are available to community teams and available for rent.

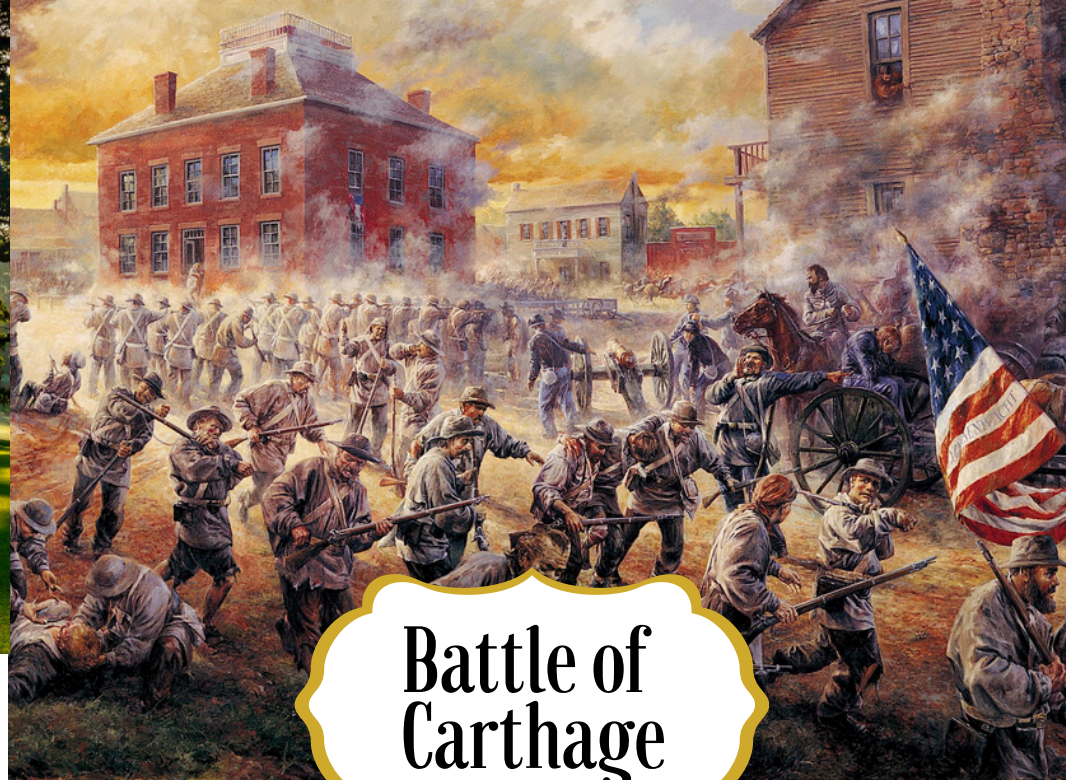
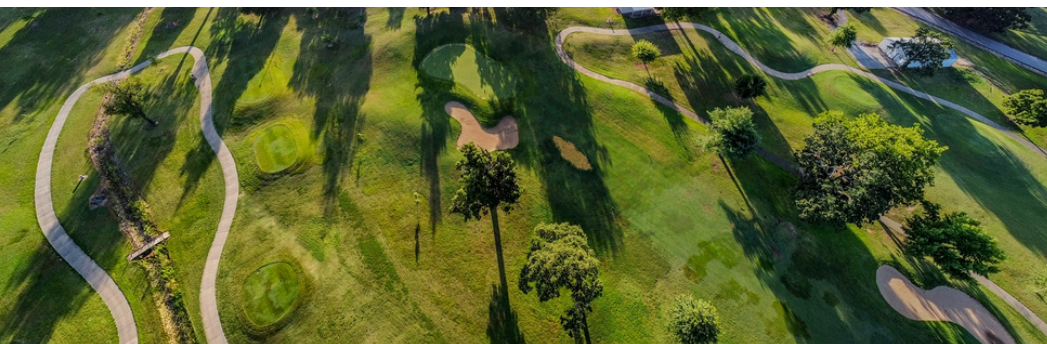

Eighteen challenging golf holes are situated on a 120-acre site. From our back tees, the course is 6413 yards long. The distance from the forward tees is 4923 yards. The course is a Par 71 with a slope rating of 121 from the back tees, and 108 from the forward tees. Two ponds, two winding creeks, over 30 bunkers and narrow fairways will test your golfing skills at our maintained facility.

Battle of Carthage

On July 4th, 1861 led by Colonel Franz Sigel, approximately 1,000 Union troops and his German-American volunteers marched into Carthage. They camped in the vicinity of what is now the intersection of River and East Chestnut streets. At the same time, over 6,000 Missouri State Guardsmen led by a pro-southern leader, Governor Claiborne Fox Jackson were camped 18 miles north of Carthage. On the morning of July 5th, Jackson led his forces south as Sigel and his men advanced north. They met about 9 miles north of Carthage and a battle resulted, lasting through the day. This battle continued into Carthage and ended at Carter's Spring.

The Battle of Carthage may have been the first engagement in the Civil War where two opposing armies came from hundreds of miles marching and had contact with each other using traditional battle formations. When the Battle of Carthage was over, the Southern forces under Missouri Governor Claiborne Fox Jackson's command, had won an important victory. Colonel Franz Sigel, the Union commander, would receive national attention from the Battle of Carthage and become a hero to the German-American Unionists in the country.

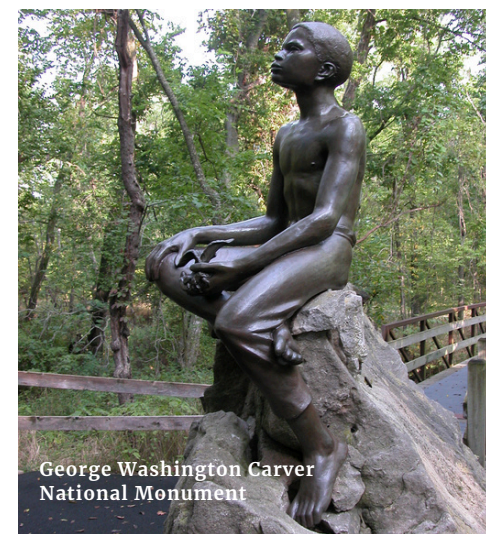

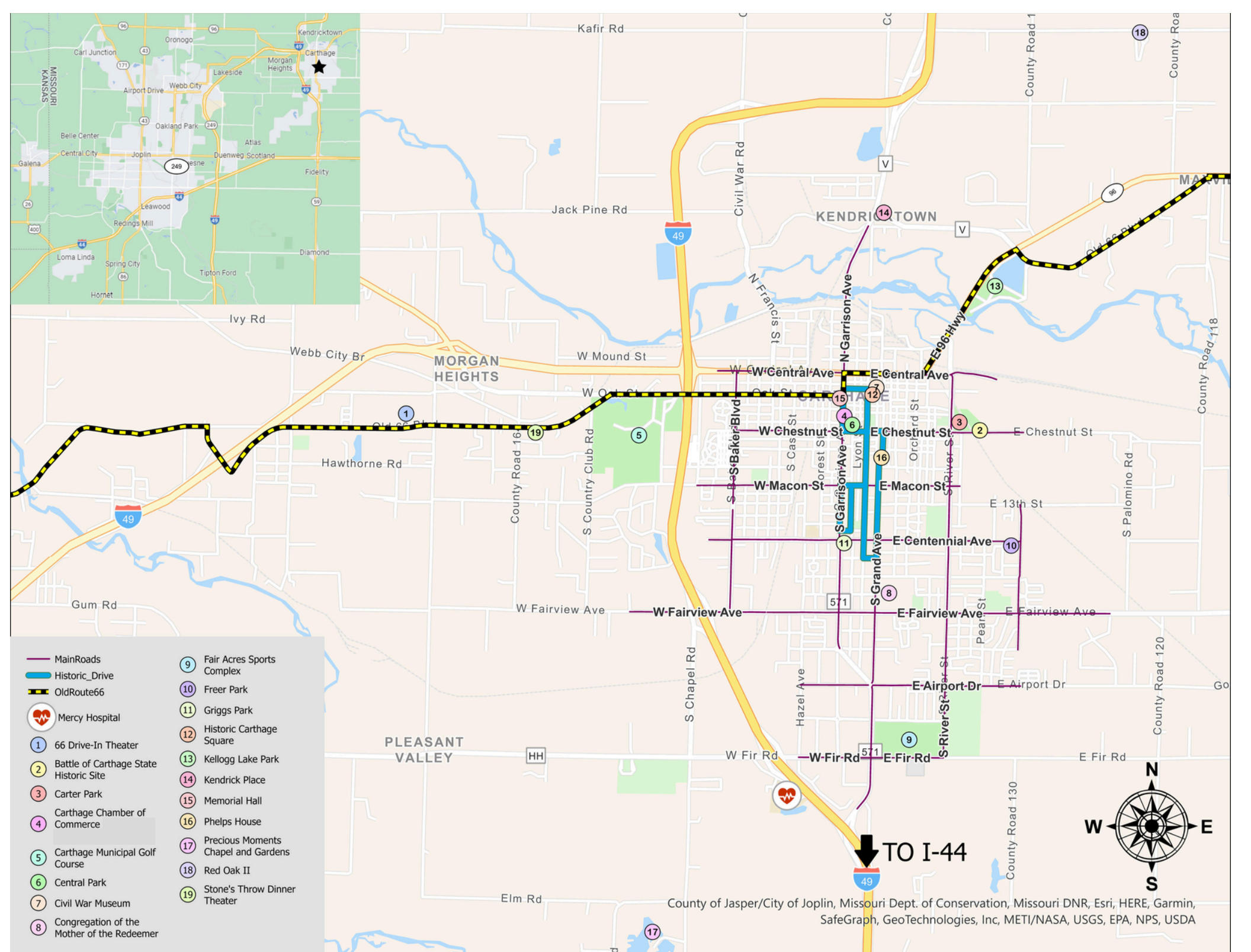

Red Oak II

A Town from Yesterday



Just a couple miles northeast of Carthage, and just off of Route 66 you will discover Red Oak II! Created by artist, Lowell Davis, this town looks like a ghost town from years past, but it is actually the complete opposite.

What is Red Oak II?

Red Oak II was the brainchild of internationally known artist, Lowell Davis. Davis was born and raised in a town 20 miles north of Carthage, Missouri known as Red Oak, Missouri. After becoming an adult, Davis left Red Oak. After a number of years, Davis returned to his hometown to find that Red Oak had become a ghost town. After discovering this, he bought buildings from Red Oak and moved them to his family's land near Carthage and gave them new life. He called this creation, Red Oak II. Wandering through Red Oak II you will find a collection of early 20th century buildings like a general store, a Phillips 66 station, an old school house and even an old cemetery.

Today, each of the buildings in Red Oak II are privately owned. Davis lived in the Belle Starr house, where the infamous lady outlaw lived. Davis passed away at his home in November of 2020 at the age of 83. Red Oak II welcomes visitors from all over the world. When visiting Red Oak II, please stay on the gravel road and be mindful that this is a private community.

Where can I find Red Oak II?

Directions to Red Oak II - Take MO 96 east out of Carthage about one mile. Then turn north on County Road 130 for almost two miles to Kafir Road, then turn right. Red Oak II is about 3/4 miles down the road.

Carthage Historic Homes District

Jasper County, Missouri was formed in 1841. Carthage, Missouri, the Jasper County seat was founded in 1842.

Carthage boasts four historic districts listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The large residential district south of the Jasper County Courthouse is one of these. Bankers, mine owners, doctors and merchants flocked to Carthage growing this district. In the early 1900s Carthage was nationally known as the city with the most millionaires per capita in the nation. The district hosts examples of Italianate, Romanesque, Queen Anne, Classical Revival, and Eastlake architecture.

Maple Leaf Festival
Est. 1966



Beginning in 1966 as a marching band competition, the annual Maple Leaf Festival took its name from Mother Nature's array of glorious fall colors. Every year, the city of Carthage proudly welcomes 80,000+ visitors to this wonderful fall celebration.

Every year, on the 3rd Saturday of October, the biggest day of the festival begins with the largest parade in Southwest Missouri. This keystone event begins at 9 a.m. and ends around noon. The parade starts near the Historic Square and ends at the Carthage Jr. High.

Events are scheduled throughout the day including a band festival, art & crafts vendors, car and tractor shows, wine tasting, quilt show, food vendors, and live entertainment.

The month of October is filled with activities including art and museum exhibits, lobster boil, bike tour, carnival, evening 5K, beauty pageants, dog show, gospel sing, cruise-in, and a lip-sync competition. The Maple Leaf Festival welcomes you.
